## **SAFETY CORNER—**

### **Jacklines: A Powerboat Follow-up**

Here's the situation. It's summer 2004 in Hawaii with relatively calm seas and water temperature somewhere in the 70s, more or less, ideal weather. Here are two true stories.

Two outboard-equipped fishing boats were found, motors running, with nobody on board. Both skippers had logged many open-ocean hours and were considered "experienced."

In one situation, a fisherman called his wife and said that he'd caught a marlin and was heading in. His boat was found several hours later, run up on a beach with the engine running, and the marlin strapped to the stern of the boat. Since the GPS was still functioning the Coast Guard was able to reconstruct the boat's course. Despite knowing the exact path that the boat had traversed, no trace of the fisherman was found.

The second boat was found, at sea, still trolling for fish. The boat had only been out for a few hours when it was sighted, running with no crew. In this case the CG had a reasonable estimate of the area in which to concentrate the search. The skipper was never found.

Apparently, there were no signs, on either boat, of jacklines or tethers. Whether the skippers were wearing PFDs is only a matter of conjecture. Perhaps, these skippers had done similar solo trips hundreds of times.

Is there a moral? In my humble opinion, yes. Install jacklines on your powerboat and use a tether in addition to your PFD. At the risk of violating grammar rules..."You may go out hundreds of times, *you don't return only once.*"
